#### MINISTRY OF PRAISE—A WORD FROM DEACON FILIPS

Greetings Fellow Prayer Warriors!

Ann and I recently returned from a riverboat cruise through the heart of Europe. The most beautiful and memorable things we saw were the 500–1000-year-old churches and cathedrals. I was constantly amazed at the faith of our ancestors who built such things. On a couple of occasions, other people on our tour would say something like; "It's a shame that those poor medieval peasants

occasions, other people on our tour would say something like; "It's a shame that those poor medieval peasants had to pay all that money to build this extravagant building. There was never enough time to explain the theology of beautiful churches to them and start an argument, but I want to explain it to you now.

First of all, those churches and cathedrals were not for the priests and bishops! Yes, they minister there, and they do enjoy them, but they do not own the buildings and do not pass them down in their family. Those churches belong to the people! Including me and everyone else who has their breath taken away by the beauty 1000 years later. Those dirt-poor medieval peasants who helped build those fantastic churches and cathedrals had ownership in them. They could go and have their faith built up by the most beautiful art and architecture in the world, anytime they wanted. Here was a little bit of heaven on earth that they could visit every Sunday and Holy Day.

There is a new book out called Living in Wonder by Rod Dreher. He talks about what he calls enchantment. Enchantment is simply having contact with the larger reality of God outside of our material world. "Reality is much more than we think it is." He also says "enchantment is not achieved by conveying information but by preparing yourself, so you are looking at the right corner of the sky when the comet comes blazing past." This comet is God, coming to meet us and raise us up to His level. Sometimes the beauty of classic churches, reverent music and liturgy, can do that. Do not become protestant and utilitarian in your worship. Don't be ashamed to be Catholic in all of the weird ways that we have. We should love our weird stained glass, and incense, vestments, rituals, rosaries, and beautiful churches and cathedrals. And always give God glory in your worship. Be weird in a Catholic way. It is what Jesus intended.

#### ARGUMENTS AGAINST THE PROTESTANT DOCTRINE OF SOLA SCRIPTURA

Not everything Christians believe can be detailed in the Bible. Here are some arguments against the doctrine of Sola Scriptura: The Bible says that we should not live with a person of the opposite sex without being married, but nowhere in the Bible does it say how to marry someone. There is no formula in the Bible; Christian marriage is a tradition handed down from the early Church. Luther and other Protestants did not reject this particular tradition. Why did they reject the Eucharistic tradition and not the marriage tradition? We don't know. The Catholic Church preserves all sacred traditions from Jesus and the Apostles.

Jesus both washed the feet of His disciples and celebrated the first Eucharist with them at the Last Supper. Why do we have the Eucharist every week and foot washing only on Holy Thursday? It is because of the tradition handed down from the Apostles who had the authority to decide the importance of weekly or daily Eucharist versus foot washing.

Why are there four gospels and not just one? Any one of them is true. Why were there twelve apostles? If God is all - powerful, he could have built His Church on one apostle or one gospel. The Christian faith is handed down as a symphony. It is not just one instrument (the Bible), but it is the symphony created by all of the writers of the Gospel, all of the traditions handed down by the Church, and the authority of the Magisterium. All of these parts create the whole of the faith, but no part can contradict any other. They all must agree. The Pope cannot wake up one day and declare that he will now ordain "women priests," or anything else that contradicts Sacred Tradition or the Bible.








Children's Mass on 11—10—24





Turtle Doves = Old and New Testaments





Golden Rings = First Five Books of the Old Testament - "Pentateuch"



Over-stimulate their minds so that they cannot hear that still, small voice."

"Entice them to blare their music, call or text whenever they drive; keep the TV, gaming systems, computers and iPads going constantly in their home and see to it that every store and restaurant in the world plays non-biblical music constantly. This will jam their minds and break that union with Christ. Pound their minds with the news 24 hours a day and with senseless ads and inappropriate programming. Invade their driving moments with billboards. Flood their mailboxes with junk mail, sweepstakes, and every kind of newsletter and promotional offering free products, services and false hopes."

"Keep skinny, beautiful models on the magazines, computers, and TV so their husbands will believe that outward beauty is what's important, and they'll become dissatisfied with their wives. Keep the wives too tired to love their husbands at night. Give them headaches, too! If they don't give their husbands the love they need, they will begin to look elsewhere. That will fragment their families quickly! Give them Santa Claus to distract them from teaching their children the real meaning of Christmas. Give them an Easter bunny so they won't talk about his resurrection and power over sin and death."

"Even in their recreation, let them be excessive . . . have them return from their recreation exhausted. Keep them too busy to go out in nature and reflect on God's creation. Send them to amusement parks, sporting events, camping, and movies instead. Keep them busy, busy, busy! And when they meet for spiritual fellowship, leave with troubled consciences. Crowd their lives with so many good causes they have no time to seek power from Jesus. Soon they will be working in their own strength, sacrificing their health and family for the good of the cause."





# Nebraska passes constitutional amendment to protect unborn babes in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> trimester

Thanks to the strong values in our state, and the all-out colossal efforts of prolifers throughout the state, voters passed #434 in November's election. Of the 926,912 votes cast throughout the state, 54.94% voted to amend our state constitution to protect lives of unborn babies in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> trimesters.

Closer to home, in Boyd County 1,043 total votes were cast on #434, with 83.41% for and 16.59% against. In Holt County 5,344 votes were cast, with 78.71% for and 21.29% against.

While #434 does not outlaw abortion in the 1<sup>st</sup> trimesters, it does allow current legislative restrictions to stand, and enables more to be passed by the Unicameral. According to the Nebraska Catholic Conference, "This is an incremental step toward protection for all innocent life, not a permanent solution or final compromise."

Nebraska bishops endorsed the amendment as a defensive move against the proabortion #439 amendment, cautioning that Catholics must still be committed to securing more protection for babies in the 1<sup>st</sup> trimester.

Amendment #439, which would have secured the right to abortion throughout pregnancy in the state constitution, did not pass statewide, or in Boyd and Holt Counties. Out of 1,044 votes cast in Boyd County, 16.86% were for and 83.14% against. Of the 5,339 votes cast in Holt County, 21.37% were for and 78.63% were against.

Voter turnout was 84.88% in Boyd County, and 78.17% in Holt County. Statewide turnout was 76.39%.

Boyd Holt Right to Life thanks the phenomenal number of volunteers who collected signatures and campaigned to protect lives during this election cycle. The magnitude of their help and sincerity of their voices were critical to stopping the effort to secure abortion as a fundamental right in Nebraska's Constitution. Continued support and effort are just as important now to expand protection to babies and moms in the first trimester.
